
Summary


- Total donations to the AABP Foundation include restricted donations (scholarships, grants, auction, 5k) and unrestricted donations. In FY 2023, total donations to the AABP Foundation were \$149,843 compared to \$215,816 in FY 2022.
- Total *unrestricted* donations and auction proceeds to the AABP Foundation were \$43,630 compared to \$28,821 in FY 2022. This was the first year the benefit auction held at the annual conference was shared between the AABP Foundation and the Amstutz Scholarship Fund.
- Total assets for the Foundation as of 12/31/2023 were \$1,787,506 compared to \$1,589,866 on 12/31/2022 representing primarily loss of value in the investment funds of the Foundation.
- As part of the Foundation assets, the Amstutz Scholarship Fund (ASF) value totals \$1,313,164 as of 12/31/2023 compared to \$1,168,290 on 12/31/2022.
- Total donations and auction proceeds to the ASF for FY2023 were \$77,887 versus \$86,408 in FY2022.
- The Foundation awarded 51 scholarships to 42 veterinary students in FY 2023 totaling \$323,000 in student scholarship funding. This is an increase from \$249,500 awarded in 2022.
- Industry support of student scholarships included \$90,000 from Merck Animal Health and \$120,000 from the Zoetis Foundation.
- Industry support of the Amstutz Scholarship Stampede 5K is supported by Boehringer Ingelheim.





AABP Foundation Research Grants Awarded

In 2023, the AABP Foundation awarded a total of \$46,967 in research grants. Research grants are funded entirely by member donations. In 2023, Dr. Kee Jim generously supported the AABP Foundation Research Grant with a \$25,000 donation.

The competitive research grants funded by the AABP Foundation in 2022 were:

Dr. Jessica McArt – Cornell University, \$24,995 In Search of a Novel Cost-Effective Diagnostic for Subclinical Hypocalcemia

Dr. Manuel Chamorro – Auburn University, \$21,972 Effect of time and colostrum-derived serum antibody titers on the performance of various bovine viral diarrhea virus (BVDV) persistent infection (PI) diagnostic tests in neonatal calves Beginning in 2012, the AABP Foundation has funded a total of 32 research projects totaling \$736,270. The purpose of the AABP Foundation research grants is to provide funds to support clinically relevant and practical research for bovine practitioners. Proposals may address clinically relevant research topics in beef cattle, dairy cattle or both and can include topics such as disease treatment or prevention, production medicine, or cattle welfare. Request for proposals opens in October of each year and closes in December. Investigators must complete the project, present the findings at an AABP annual conference, and submit the project for publication in a peer-reviewed journal.
