The 2018 51st AABP Annual Conference is off to a great start with a large attendance in Phoenix. This week started off with 14 Preconference Seminars, a special Food Animal Educators Symposium on Wednesday, and the Welcome Reception sponsored by Boehringer Ingelheim.

Food Animal Educators Symposium

The first AABP Food Animal Educators Symposium was held yesterday in Phoenix. There were 36 educators representing 24 different colleges from the U.S. and Canada in attendance.

“As bovine faculty, we are responsible for educating future bovine practitioners, and what the future of bovine veterinary medicine looks like is changing incredibly fast,” says symposium coordinator Dr. Emmanuel Rollin. “This year, we expanded from a short breakfast meeting into a full day symposium, which allowed us to really dissect the issues we face and take the time to come up with actionable steps to improve the connection between the students, the faculty, bovine practitioners and the AABP organization.”

Rollin said the group learned from each other how they can be more effective in their respective colleges, and also work together better. “We discussed and prioritized the challenges in bovine education on which we can work together and have a positive influence. This includes things like curriculum

development, communicating with students about what to expect in the profession, and creating a roadmap for success that will help guide students toward valuable experiences outside of their college curriculum.”

Rollin says the issues we discussed will continue to be worked on by symposium attendees in the coming months in collaboration with AABP, and will ultimately improve bovine education both during and after veterinary school.
